GENERAL RULES:

Setup of Exhibits will take place on Monday, August 5^{th} and Tuesday, August 6^{th} from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm.

Exhibits shall not be removed from the hall until Sunday, August 18th from 8:00 am to 11:00 am.

No entries will be admitted after 6:00 pm on August 6.

Rules subject to change without notice

All Rules and Regulations as found on page 7 will also apply to all classes and categories.

Please call early for reservations. Reservations should be made on or before August 1st.

Vegetables, Fruits & Berries must be a product of the 2024 crop. No potted plants and only one (1) exhibitor per garden. All Exhibits should be prepared at home and ready to be displayed. Vegetables, Fruits & Berries should be clean and in uniform, there will be no cleaning of vegetables, Fruits & Berries in building.

All items must be raised by exhibitor. Items will be judged for uniformity, cleanliness & color.

Fifteen (15) entries within Dept. 1 will be required in order to receive 1 Season Pass, NO exceptions. Children under 12 who enter less than 15 items in Dept. 1 will receive one (1) day pass, NO exceptions.

HOW TO SELECT AND PREPARE YOUR PRODUCE FOR AN AWARD WINNING EXHIBIT

Judging Standards:

- Excellent: Clean, free from any damage, uniform in size, true to variety.
- Good: Free from damage (no more than 5% loss of total weight), relatively uniform in size, fairly true to variety.
- Worthy: Fairly clean, free from serious damage (no more than 10% loss of total weight), fairly uniform in size.
- No Award: Dirty, Seriously damaged, overmature, extremely different in size, shape or color.

Tips:

- Trim Correctly: Cut off tops of all root crops about 1 inch above roots
- Quantity: Check Categories for proper quantity.
- Wash or Brush: Harvest only clean vegetables or wash with soft brush or cloth.
- Type: Specimens must represent type of variety.
- Size: Specimens should be uniform in size. Oversize are often coarse, while under-size often lack of typical color.
- Roots: Stems and roots should be either "all off" or "all on".
- Hint: Provide detail about your exhibit. Retain your seed packet for this information. When exhibiting several specimens, try to have them uniform in size and level of ripening. Remember, the largest may not be ideal.




